



**BYLAW 2022-866  
ELECTION BYLAW  
VILLAGE OF CARBON  
IN THE  
PROVINCE OF ALBERTA**

**A BYLAW OF VILLAGE OF CARBON, IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, TO PROVIDE FOR MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS IN VILLAGE OF CARBON.**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Local Authorities Election Act, Section 29, an elected authority may require that every nomination be accompanied by a deposit in the amount specified by bylaw.

**AND WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Local Authorities Election Act, Section 33(1), an elected authority may provide for events in circumstances of a death of a candidate.

**AND WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Local Authorities Election Act, Section 53.01(1), An elected authority may provide for the number and types of identification that are required to be produced by a person to verify the person's name and current address for the purpose of determining whether the person is eligible to vote.

**NOW THEREFORE**, the Council of Village of Carbon, duly assembled, enacts as follows:

**PART ONE            TITLE**

1. This Bylaw shall be known as the "Election Bylaw".

**PART TWO            NOMINATION DEPOSIT**

2. Village of Carbon Council hereby enacts that every nomination for the office of Councillor for Village of Carbon must be accompanied by a cash deposit as provided in Village of Carbon's Master Rates Bylaw.

**PART THREE        DEATH OF A CANDIDATE**

3. If a candidate for any position dies after being nominated but before 9:00 a.m. on Election Day, the election for that position will be discontinued, and the appropriate elected authority will arrange a new election for the position as soon as practicable.
4. The appropriate Elected Authority will arrange a new election for the position as soon as practicable.

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**PART FOUR          TRANSITION**

**5.          SEVERABILITY**

If a portion of this bylaw is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the invalid portion will be voided, and the rest of the bylaw remains valid and effective.

**6.          DOCUMENTS REQUIRED**

1. Government issued photo identification that includes civic address.
2. If a civic address is not contained in the piece of government issued identification the elector will need to provide documentation that includes civic address proving residency.

**7.          EFFECTIVE DATE**

This bylaw comes into effect upon third reading of this bylaw.

**8.          BYLAW REPEAL**

Any previous Municipal Election Bylaws are hereby repealed.

**READ** a first time on this 3rd day of October 2022.

**READ** a second time on this 17<sup>th</sup> day of October 2022.

**READ** a third and final time and passed on this 17<sup>th</sup> day of October 2022.
